

DRESS CODE FOR ALL GUESTS

How we carry ourselves—and what we choose to wear—often reflects how we view ourselves. Clothing is one way we express confidence and healthy self-esteem, and that is completely appropriate. Challenges arise, however, when what we wear becomes a distraction or a stumbling block to those around us. While distractions are a part of life, Scripture reminds us to be mindful of how our choices affect others:

"Woe to the world because of stumbling blocks! For it is necessary that stumbling-blocks come, but woe to that man by whom the stumbling block comes!" -Matthew 18:7

At Camp Mashiach, our goal is to create an environment where everyone can focus on seeing the LORD move in their lives. To support that purpose, we ask all guests to take personal responsibility for how they present themselves and to practice self-control in what they choose to see, hear, and wear. Our dress expectations are designed to reduce unnecessary distractions and help us honor one another in faith.

GUYS: Show respect to your sisters in faith by being mindful of your appearance and your conduct.

- **Wear your pants at the waist; no underwear should be visible.**
- **Tank tops are acceptable as long as they are not low-cut under the arms.**
- **A shirt must be worn when going to and from the showers and the pool.**

GIRLS: Show respect to your brothers in faith by being aware of how you present yourself and choosing clothing that reflects modesty and consideration.

- **If an outfit is difficult to get into or out of, requires constant adjusting, reveals body parts through the fabric, or draws attention to your body before your face, it is likely not modest.**
- **Avoid overly form-fitting or skin-tight clothing, low-cut tops, crop tops, spaghetti straps, or visible bra straps.**
- **Leggings/Yoga Pants are permitted only when:**
 - Worn under a dress, tunic, or shirt long enough to cover the hips and butt, or
 - Paired with loose athletic shorts worn over them.

EVERYONE: This camp is a place where we gather to learn about and honor Yeshua and our Father. To help maintain an atmosphere that reflects this purpose, we ask that all participants choose clothing that supports a positive, uplifting environment. Please avoid items that display imagery or messages that conflict with this goal, such as dark or unsettling themes, secular bands or musicians, or politically or socially charged content.

- **For co-ed swimming and water activities, participants must wear a dark T-shirt and shorts.**
- **Clothing with inappropriate phrases or images is not permitted, and we ask that all attire remain free from political or social agenda messaging.**

Camp Mashiach takes these expectations very seriously. If someone's behavior or clothing becomes harmful or distracting to the well-being of others, we may take action, including asking that individual to leave camp. Our goal is always to protect the spiritual, emotional, and physical safety of everyone present.

The very next verse in Matthew offers a strong reminder of the weight of our influence on others:

"And if your hand or your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off and throw it from you. It is better for you to enter life lame or crippled, rather than having two hands or two feet, to be thrown into the everlasting fire."

Matthew 18:8



FEMALE MODESTY GUIDELINES FOR ALL LADIES ATTENDING

SWIMSUITS: Modest one-piece or modest two-piece. For Girls-Only swim, girls do not have to wear t-shirts or shorts over swimsuits in the pool.

FOR ALL GUYS ATTENDING

SWIMSUITS: No speedos. For Guys-Only swim, guys do not have to wear t-shirts while in the pool area.
